Talk to members of your family to find out what has changed since they were ten years old. What things have changed and what has stayed the same? Is the world a better place now?	Take a look at some old family photographs. Create a timeline for your family showing important events such as births, marriages, birthdays, house moves etc.	What is your earliest memory? Video yourself talking about it or write it down ready to tell the class. Compare your earliest memory with those of your classmates.	Research the most important technological inventions in the last 100 years (e.g. the internet, mobile phones, video games, MRI scans etc). Can you imagine life without them now?  Conduct a survey with family and friends to find out what they would miss the most if they had
Design and create a time machine of your own.	Research some scientific arguments about time travel. Do you think it will ever be possible?	Draw and label a design for a product that would be used in the future. What would it do? How would it make life easier?	to do without it.  If you could travel to any period of time, anywhere in the world, where would you go? Make a scrap book of your chosen time period and explain what you would do while you were there.
Take digital photographs of as many different types of watches you can find and create a montage. Design a watch of your own using your collected images as inspiration. What would be the exciting functions of your watch?	Create portraits of your family. Will you draw, paint or use photography and/or computer software? Think about line, shape, colour and mood.	Investigate how an aspect of everyday life has changed over the past 200 years. Present your findings on a chronological timeline using images and text.	Use mixed media to create a collage that reflects your hopes and dreams for the future. You could add text using newspaper print or printed fonts.
