

Spelling Test on Tuesday 8th December

Suffixes: -ness and -ment

These suffixes begin with a consonant so they are added straight onto the root word,
e.g. sad... sadness

The only exception is when the root word ends in 'y' and has more than one syllable – then you drop the 'y' and add an 'i' before the suffix.

e.g. lazy... laziness

Note: The root words needing a 'ness' suffix are all adjectives, e.g. dark – darkness, whereas the root words requiring a 'ment' suffix are nearly always verbs, e.g. punish – punishment.
