This half term...

Topic: Our geography-based topic this half term is 'Tremors'. Children will develop their atlas and map reading skills; learn about the human and physical impact of volcanoes, earthquakes and tsunamis, including a focus on Pompeii and the Japanese tsunami of 2011; and find out about different rock types and their uses.

English: Our first English unit will be a narrative recount of eruption of Mt. Vesuvius from the perspective of a Pompeii resident. We will also complete a tsunami survival guide and a newspaper report about a fictional natural disaster.

Maths: Maths lessons will not be delivered in registration groups so your child may be taught by Mr Thomas OR Miss Usher. The focus of the first few weeks will be place value, moving on to addition and subtraction. See below for times tables information.





Other information

- PE kit will be needed for our sessions on a
 Wednesday. At this time of year there may still be opportunities to go outside; please ensure that children have their full kit available to them.
- The year four children will also have **chess** on a Wednesday afternoon.
- At the end of this academic year, all year four children across the country will complete a standardised times tables test. The expectation is that by the end of year four pupils should be fluent in all times tables up to 12x. Your child will often be directed towards a particular times table for a test by Mr Thomas or Miss Usher, however, it is essential that they practice as much as possible in their free time. Useful reminders

Homework

Reading at home

Children are expected to read at home at least 4 times per week. Please sign your child's record / planner each time your child reads at home. Children will receive a free book of their choice when they reach termly milestones! Children are expected to reach 50 reads by Christmas.

Packed lunches

Packed lunches should be well balanced with a mixture of savoury and sweet. Packets of sweets or fizzy drinks should not be included as part of a packed lunch. As we have a number of children with peanut allergies no packed lunches should contain nuts, peanut butter sandwiches or Nutella sandwiches.
