Topic:

Topic: Our new topic 'Tribal Tales' looks at 'prehistory' starting with the Stone Age, moving forward through the Bronze Age and then the Iron Age. To supplement this topic we will be visiting the Ironstone Mining Museum. Particular areas of focus include: cave art, Stonehenge and early settlements, including Skara Brae and hillforts.

English: We will be looking at letter writing linked to the novel Stig of the Dump and persuasive writing, including Stone Age menus and Iron Age house adverts. Fortnightly spelling tests will also continue.

Maths: The focus of the next few weeks in maths will be written methods for multiplication and division, before we move into some work on fractions.





Other information

- Indoor PE kit will be needed for our sessions on a Tuesday afternoon. Year four are doing gymnastics indoor. Although it can be done barefoot, plimsolls are also a good option.
- The year four children will continue to have chess on a Wednesday afternoon.
