School Hours

Nursery (Morning Session)8.45 a.m. - 11.45 a.m.Nursery (Afternoon Session)12.30 p.m. - 3.30 p.m.

Main School (Doors open 8.50 a.m.) 9.00 – 3.15pm

Morning break is between 10.40 and 10.55 a.m. for the whole school. The lower school has an afternoon break at a time when the class teacher feels they need it.

Access to school

Morning

We ask that Parents/Carers don't arrive on the playground before 8.45am ready for the doors to open at 8.50am.

Afternoon Nursery

The gates will not be opened until 12.25pm. We ask that Parents/Carers do not come any earlier as you will not be able to come onto the school site to wait until 12.25pm.

Home time

The gates will be opened at 3pm.

Attendance

Our aim is that every child maintains a good level of attendance as this is important in ensuring that children are able to maximise their opportunities and achieve their true potential. As a guide the following figures indicate our expectations:

Above 98% excellent attendance
96% good attendance
+ 90% satisfactory
85-90% poor attendance
(this is equivalent to at least ½ day absent per week)
- 85% unacceptable

Obviously there are times when children are unwell or infectious and cannot come to school. Please keep the school informed; let us know as soon as possible, immediately by telephoning the school office between 09:00 and 09:30.

We have a first day contact system, which means that we will contact you if a child does not arrive at school and where no message has been received. Our first day contact coordinator (Mrs Palmer) monitors attendance and punctuality very closely.

If possible, try to arrange any dental and doctor's appointments outside of school hours. If you do need to remove your child from class, please keep this to as short a period as possible and let us know beforehand. Please provide the office with evidence of any appointments.

The school strongly advises that parents make every attempt not to arrange holidays or to take occasional days leave during school time: amendments to school regulations make it clear that the Head Teacher may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are **exceptional circumstances**. If you do intend making a request for an exceptional leave of absence, you need to be aware that the DfE's statutory guidance states that even where leave can be granted, the number of days a child can be away from school should be determined by the Head Teacher.

Middlesbrough LA and The Avenue Primary School have agreed a common practice in defining the criteria for determining exceptional leave and has published a common Request for Exceptional Leave Form. This is obtainable from the office or below and it is important that you give as much information as possible to help us in our decision.

We are working under the Government's new guidelines on attendance and lateness and as always, we want to work with our families to ensure the best for our pupils. However, parents must be aware that unauthorised absences that are not deemed to be 'exceptional circumstances' may be liable to fixed penalty fines by the Local Authority.

We work in partnership with Educational Welfare Limited. They are available every Tuesday to discuss any issues related to attendance.

The Curriculum

At The Avenue we believe that the curriculum should be as exciting and stimulating as possible. We actively seek to promote a love of learning by making school fun and relevant whilst at the same time ensuring standards are high in order to prepare your children for their future.

The Nursery and Reception children follow the National Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum and works towards the children achieving the Government's desirable outcomes on entering compulsory education. We recognise that young children learn through exploratory play and structured activities. Our EYFS children develop their self-confidence, independence and social skills in a secure and happy environment.

From Year 2 onwards the children are taught swimming as part of the National Curriculum. Swimming is taught in mixed gender classes.

The staff and governors work together to continually develop our school's curriculum content to ensure that the very best provision is made to extend children's skills in every way. In particular we focus on each child's linguistic, scientific, creative, mathematical, technological, physical and social development as well as concerning ourselves deeply with their moral and spiritual growth.



School Meals

The school is committed to encouraging a healthy lifestyle. We have regularly achieved the National Healthy Schools Status. School meals are cooked on the premises and are of a very high standard. Payment is made in advance, on the first day of each half-term or by cheque. Payment may also be made weekly on a Monday. Cash or cheques should be brought to school sealed in an envelope and marked with the child's name, class and the amount contained.

If you wish your child to change from school dinners to packed lunches then we ask for a half terms notice.

How much is a Primary school meal?

The current price of a Primary and Nursery school meal is £1.90 per day. School meals cheques should be made payable to James Cook Learning Trust.

All pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive a school meal at no cost to the parent/guardian due to government funding. School meals are healthy, tasty, social and fun and from September 2014 choosing a school lunch for your child/children will help save you up to £400 per year if you take up the offer.

How can I see if I am eligible for Free School Meals?

The Free School Meal section is part of School Support and they can be contacted on 01642 726541. Children whose parents/carers receive Income Support, Job Seekers Allowance, or Child Tax Credit may be entitled to free school meals. Please contact the school office for the necessary forms and confidential advice. You can also go to the Middlesbrough Council website to download an application form and for more information.

Free School Meals and the Pupil Premium

The government has allocated additional funding to schools in the form of 'The Pupil Premium'. One of the criteria used to calculate this additional funding is the number of pupils at a school who receive Free School Meals (FSMs). In common with most schools it is likely that a number of parents/carers whose children come to The Avenue don't claim FSMs, even though they are entitled to them.

As I am sure you will agree the children at our school can only benefit if we are able to attract additional funding. Not only that, our catering team provides an excellent range of healthy lunch options that are enjoyed daily by a significant number of our pupils. Your child may well be able to access these **free of charge**.

If you are eligible for and claim FSMs, you may also be provided with other services by the school, such as

- Free access to some before and after school provision.
- Access to additional support for your child's learning

My child needs a Special Diet, are you able to feed him/her?

Special diets can be catered for. Examples may include Diabetic, Coeliac and Low Fat diets. The Council now has a Peanut Allergy Policy in place. Please contact Angela Blower on 01642 728030 for more information.

In order for us to provide a child with special dietary requirements, however, we must have written confirmation from the Paediatric Dietician that the child is under. They then forward us the necessary medical dietary information to enable our cooks to provide your child with the appropriate meals.

Packed Lunches

Children may bring a packed lunch and a drink for their midday meal. Drinks should be brought in a plastic container or unbreakable plastic flask. Fizzy drinks, sweets or chocolate are not permitted and lunches should contain no nuts. Please can grapes be cut in half if sent as part of the lunch. Lunches must be brought in a suitable lunch box, clearly labelled on the outside.

Water at School

Children are encouraged to bring bottles of water to school to drink throughout the day. Research has shown that this helps to keep the children more alert and focused during the school day. Bottles should be clearly marked with the child's name and may be refilled from the water fountains in school.

Security and the School Site

The security of the children on the school site is of paramount importance at all times. No staff are appointed who do not have full DBS Clearance. Similarly volunteers are also all checked. Contractors and people who come onto the site to work in school also have to have full clearance before they are allowed in school time. We operate a strict checking and signing in procedure on arrival at the school for all but regular staff.

We have CCTV cameras around the site and there is security on all entry doors. We expect all visitors, including parents, to come to the office. During school hours some of the perimeter and internal gates are locked. Children know that they must not open doors to let people into school even if it is someone they know well. (The nursery operates a similar but slightly different system).
