

Reading in Nursery

We aim to develop a love of reading in children from an early age. We share quality texts during shared reading, planned learning contexts and in the continuous provision. Enjoying books and reading stories from an early age helps with children's ability to understand words. It encourages them to develop their own imagination and to develop their speech.

What will my child experience in a Nursery session?

- Children will be exposed to high quality picture books at story time which provide the children with a wide range of new vocabulary.
- Children will be given the opportunity to comment on stories and use the illustrations to support their thoughts.
- Children will explore a range of different genres such as fiction, non-fiction, poetry, religious stories and traditional tales.
- Children will listen to at least one story each day. By doing this, children are having thought provoking, extended conversations with adults about what they have read.
- Children will be also be exposed to oral segmenting and blending games during a
 variety of listening activities and when working in the provision. This will prepare
 them for the transition into Reception where they will start the Reception SoundsWrite phonics scheme.

How can you help at home?

- Talk with your child
- Allow children to act out their favourite stories for others in their family to watch
- Chat, talk, speak to, whisper and sing with your child
- Play 'I-spy' when you are out and talk about things in the environment
- And most importantly, read and enjoy stories together. A shared story between a
 child and a familiar, loved adult has a huge impact on children's interest and
 motivation for reading throughout their education. Nursery children are free to
 choose a story from our 'Library Box' at school to enjoy with their adult.
