

Year 1 Spring 1 Project homework – Moon Zoom



Our topic this term is called ‘Moon Zoom’ which means we will be looking at what can be found in space and famous people who have explored the moon. We will also be thinking about other creatures that might be found in space!

Find out about the planets. How many are there? What are they called? Research each planet and find out some facts about each one.	With an adult, search the web for fascinating space facts and make your own ‘Space Fact Book’.	Ask an adult to help you find the names of all the people who have walked on the moon. There are 12 of them! Record a fact about each of them in your ‘Space Fact book’.	Use an app to find constellations, planets and stars in the night sky. Which constellation is the easiest to recognise? Which star is the brightest?
With an adult, explore the Hubble Telescope website. Check out those amazing gallery images!	Imagine you are an astronaut completing different space missions. Make a mini book about your work.	Make a telescope from junk cardboard materials and sticky tape. Just before bedtime, use your telescope to look up at the stars. Can you see any wonderful star patterns in the sky? Grab a piece of paper and draw the pattern of stars you can see.	Can you make up your own space song or rhyme? Teach the song to your family and perform it. Send the video on Class Dojo.

Please complete **THREE** over the half-term and send them in as soon as they are complete. While restrictions are in place, the best way to submit your child’s homework is **to send a photo on ClassDojo**. You could also attach a photograph of a model, PowerPoint, Word document etc.
