<p>During Spring, lots of baby animals are born. Can you find out the names of these baby animals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Cow *Sheep *Duck *Pig *Horse 	<p>It is important to practise writing your name regularly. Remember to use the rhymes for each of the letters in your name to form each letter correctly.</p>	<p>Independence challenge! Getting dressed on your own can be a bit of a challenge! Can you learn a new skill whilst getting ready, such as putting on your own shoes, putting your t-shirt on the correct way around or buttoning up your own cardigan?</p>
<p>Create a list of things you will need to help care for the baby chicks once they have hatched.</p>	 <p>Are eggs alive?</p>	<p>Ask an adult to write the numbers 1 - 5 on separate pieces of paper. If possible, use pegs and peg the numbers in order from 1 - 5 on a washing line.</p>
<p>Go for a walk with a grown up and look out for the signs of Spring. Look out for some springtime flowers or animals. Can you draw a picture to show what you found?</p>	<p>Create a finger painting of a beautiful blossom tree or flower using paint and your fingers.</p>	<p>Learn, practise, and enjoy some nursery rhymes about animals, such as Old MacDonald had a farm, 5 Little Ducks, Baa, Baa, Black Sheep and 5 Little Speckled Frogs. You could even learn a new one to teach us at school!</p>
