Tasks can be completed in a variety of ways - be as creative as you like!

<p>We love all the flowers we can see in Spring. Can you make your own Spring flower? Look at how many petals and leaves it has. Is it a tall flower?</p>	<p>Share a story together about a farm animal.</p>	<p>Choose one animal that comes from an egg. Then draw and label its life cycle.</p>
<p>Write a shopping list of items you might buy at a farm shop.</p>	 <p>Are Eggs Alive?</p>	<p>How many farm animals can you move like?</p>
<p>Empty an eggshell and put some wet cotton wool in the bottom. Then sprinkle some cress seeds on top and watch what happens. Make sure to keep you cress seeds wet. You could use this in an egg sandwich.</p>	<p>Write a list of how many animals you may find living on a farm. How many animals can you think of? Discuss which animal you think would be the heaviest. You could even put them in order.</p>	<p>Go on a spring walk. What can you see? Write a list of all of the changes that happen in Spring. Draw a picture to go with it. Encourage your child to listen to the sounds they can hear and write them down.</p>
