

Y6 Summer 1 Project homework – Gallery Rebels

<p>Make a mood board that shows a mood/emotion expressed in different ways - for example, with colour, pattern, texture, material or shape.</p>	<p>Create a comic strip. Look at a real-life one first and magpie the artist's techniques to help you make yours look as authentic (real) as possible.</p>	<p>Make a collage of natural objects, or collect and draw the objects, mixing subtle colours and detail. Use a magnifying glass to help you look at the smaller areas of colour and pattern. Items might include flowers, leaves, stones and pebbles, shells and tree bark.</p>	<p>Find out about artists from the past by searching for examples in art books loaned from the local library, or by using the internet. Present your findings any way you would like.</p>
<p>Practise drawing from observation. Choose a range of interesting objects to draw and experiment with patterns, shapes and forms (lines). You could draw fresh fruit, flowers, or anything else that catches your eye!</p>	<p>Decide what kind of artist you are. Are you perhaps more like the impressionist artists, the expressionists or the realists? Create a drawing and then annotate it to explain what you think. If you are unsure on what the different styles are, you could research this first!</p>	<p>Visit a local gallery to see what exhibitions are showing; take a sketchbook and make notes about the things you see. <u>Hint:</u> Due to COVID, many galleries around the world now have virtual gallery tours on their websites. Ask an adult to help you explore one or two of them.</p>	<p>Make an abstract sculpture. Explain your work to an adult and take a digital image so you can share it with others at school.</p>
<p>Create some artwork in the style of your favourite illustrator from your favourite books, or your favourite artist. <u>Hint:</u> Many illustrators have websites or YouTube videos that give hints and tips to help you copy their techniques.</p>	<p>Collect old tester paint pots and make a large-scale abstract painting on the back of a roll of old wallpaper! Do not do this straight on your walls at home, or your grown-ups will NOT be amused! 😊</p>	<p>Help a sibling with their homework.</p>	<p>Research or experiment with a different form of art. Maybe you could explore anime, fashion design, cartoons, sculpture, landscapes, printing, graphics - or something else! The choice is yours.</p>
		<p>Your own idea! Be as creative as you want. This needs to be linked to art, which is this term's topic focus.</p>
