Autumn Term 2



Our topic this term is called ‘Are carrots orange?’ which means we will be learning all about different vegetables and where they come from. We will also be learning about the changes from autumn to winter.

<p>It is really important to eat lots of fruit and vegetables because it keeps you healthy. Set yourself a challenge to see how many pieces of fruit and veg you can eat a day. Can you make a chart to record how you do?</p>	<p>Go to the shops with an adult. Look at all the different fruit and vegetables. Choose some that you have not tried before. Use your senses to describe what they smell, taste, feel and look like.</p>	<p>Get ready to go to the shops with your adult. Can you help your adult write a shopping list of all the different things you might need?</p>	<p>You can make lots of different meals using vegetables, such as vegetable soup. Can you help an adult cook a special tea? You could even look at the recipe. Does it have any vegetables in it?</p>
<p>You can even use fruit and vegetables to make pictures! Can you make your own face using different fruit and vegetables? You could also use paint to print with vegetables.</p>	<p>When we go to the shops we use a basket to carry all of our items. Can you design your own basket/ bag to help you carry your shopping? You could even take it to the shops with you to test it.</p>	<p>The seasons are starting to change. What happens as we move into winter? Discuss with your adult any changes from autumn to winter.</p>	<p>We have been comparing different groups of items using ‘more’ ‘fewer’ and ‘the same’. Can you make some groups of items in your house and compare them?</p>
