

Project Homework **Splendid Skies** – Autumn Term 2



Our topic this term is called ‘Splendid Skies’ which means we will be learning all about weather and historical flight adventures! We will be looking at different types of weather in our country and in the seven continents of the world. Here are some ideas of how you can get involved in our topic at home:

Go on a walk taking photographs of signs of the seasons such as buds, new leaves or leaves falling from the trees.	Collect rainwater in a container. How much can you collect in a week? Measure your findings in millilitres.	Make a mini-book containing pictures of yourself wearing outfits suitable for each season or weather type.	Go out on a rainy day to find the biggest, widest and deepest puddle! Take a photograph of yourself next to the puddle to see how big it really is!
Create some weather artwork. You could make a seasons tree, a rainbow or something else!	Take your teddy with you on a holiday or on a day out. Write about where teddy went, what he did and what the weather was like.	Learn how to spell weather words such as rain, wind, snow, sun, storm, wet, dry, hot and cold. Can you draw a picture with each word?	Keep a weather diary. Note down what the weather was like each day of the week. If you have a thermometer, you could also measure the temperature outside.
