<p>Make a mood board that shows a mood/emotion expressed in different ways - for example, with colour, pattern, texture, material or shape.</p>	<p>Create a comic strip. Look at a real-life one first and magpie the artist's techniques to help you make yours look as authentic (real) as possible.</p>	<p>Make a collage of natural objects, or collect and draw the objects, mixing subtle colours and detail. Use a magnifying glass to help you look at the smaller areas of colour and pattern. Items might include flowers, leaves, stones and pebbles, shells and tree bark.</p>	<p>Find out about artists from the past by searching for examples in art books loaned from the local library, or by using the internet. Present your findings any way you would like.</p>
<p>Practise drawing from observation. Choose a range of interesting objects to draw and experiment with patterns, shapes and forms (lines).</p>	<p>Decide what kind of artist you are. Are you perhaps more like the impressionist artists, the expressionists or the realists? Annotate one of your drawings and explain what you think.</p>	<p>Visit a local gallery to see what exhibitions are showing; take a sketchbook and make notes about the things you see.</p>	<p>Make an abstract sculpture. Explain your work to an adult and take a digital image so you can share it with others at school.</p>
<p>Create some drawings in the style of your favourite illustrator from your favourite books. Hint: Many illustrators have websites or YouTube videos that give hints and tips to help you copy their techniques.</p>	<p>Collect any old tester paint pots and make a large-scale abstract painting on the back of a roll of old wallpaper! Do not do this on your walls at home, or your grown-ups will NOT be amused!</p>	<p>Help a sibling with their homework.</p> <p>Your own idea! Be as creative as you want.</p>	<p>Research or experiment with a different form of art. Maybe you could explore anime, fashion design, cartoons, sculpture, landscapes, printing, graphics - or something else! The choice is yours.</p>
