



Our Curriculum




Throughout the year we will follow many different themes of learning. These will be reflected within the learning and activities of the classroom. We will keep you updated regularly on dojo with what we have been learning.

Your child will be participating in the reception baseline assessment (RBA) within the first 6 weeks of starting reception. The purpose of the assessment is to provide the starting point for a new measure that will help parents understand how well schools support their pupils to progress between reception and year 6.

Home Reading



From the first week of September your child will bring home books with sentences in for you to read to your child for the first couple of weeks.

Then they will bring home a book without any words in, for your child to discuss what is happening on each page.

Then they will move onto our reading scheme with words which match the phonetic sounds which they are learning.

Home Reading



Inside your child's reading log please sign and date every time they read at home (even throughout the school holidays) This will ensure we know when a book needs changing. Do not feel you need to comment every time, only if you feel there is something we need to.

To begin with books will be changed on a <u>Monday</u> and a <u>Thursday</u>.

This will increase as the year goes on.

Home Reading



Your child will get a reading book to bring home with a reading log. This book will support your child's learning in Phonics. The reading book and reading log need to be brought into school every day for reading in the classroom.

Dojo



A fantastic way for us to communicate with you about your child's learning.

We will update you on 'new' learning, send you photos and celebrate your child's achievements.

We also send reminders e.g. school trip on Tuesday.

Make sure you sign the Dojo permission form and return to the office.

School Rewards



<u>Dojo point system</u> – The children receive dojo points throughout the week for good work, good behaviour, manners etc. You will be able to see on the dojo app when your child receives a dojo point and what it was for. All of the children's names go into a pot at the end of the week and one name is picked. The lucky child selects a prize! The more dojos you get, the more times your name will go into the pot.

<u>Celebration Assemblies – Celebration assemblies will happen every week. We will celebrate the children's individual achievements and class achievements.</u>

How can I prepare my child for Reception?

Develop independence by:

Encouraging your child to get dressed and undressed. Although we now come into school wearing PE kits on PE days it is always helpful if your child can still take off/ put on their own jumper/ cardigan. We also have lots of opportunities for dressing up in the areas.

When you buy your child's new winter coat give them some time to practise taking it on and off and practise fastening it up.

The children have snack daily at playtime (apples, pears, carrots, satsumas, bananas) If your child doesn't eat fruit think about encouraging this over the summer as they will get peckish throughout the morning!

Practise using a knife, fork and spoon in preparation for lunch in the dining hall every day.

You could also help your child practice to write their name. This is something we will continue to work on in reception but it is always helpful if they can attempt to write their name on pieces of work etc

Uniform

- The school uniform policy states that children should wear; blue sweatshirts
 /cardigans; white polo shirts; black/grey trousers/skirts/dresses; plain
 socks/tights –black, grey, blue or white (no over the knee socks) black
 shoes.
- Blue and white check dresses can be worn during the summer.
- Please label <u>all</u> items of clothing and shoes.
- •Reception do require a <u>P.E. kit;</u> blue/black shorts, pale blue polo shirt and suitable shoes. The children will come to school in their PE kit on PE days.
- Our uniform provider is 'Lollipops' at Berwick Hills. Prices can be found in your Early Years Foundation Stage Prospectus.
- In the Autumn to allow us use our outdoor area in all weathers, please send in a pair of wellies if possible.


