# The Avenue Primary School Work from home - Year 1



#### Suggested daily timetable

Our new topic is Beat, Band and Boogie – we'll be exploring music and dancing!

	Morning Start your morning with a workout (Joe Wicks, Just Dance, BBC movers)		Afternoon	
			Begin your afternoon session with some handwriting or fine motor development e.g. playdough or threading.	
Mon	Phonics	Maths	ICT	Log in to Purple Mash and complete your Monday news.
Tue	Phonics	English	Music	Listen to the piece of music 'The Carnival of the Animals' by Camille Saint-Saens. Each part of the music represents the movements of a different animal. Listen to each movement, you could listen to it once and have a guess which animal it represents. Then find out which animal it is and listen again, how does the music represent the animals? Can you move like the animal with the music?
Wed	Phonics	Maths	P.E	During the Summer term we would have started to prepare for Sports Day by practising some of the events. Why don't you practise for your own family sports day! This week have a go at the egg and spoon race, try to keep your hand steady!
Thurs	Phonics	English	Science	Investigate how the level of water in a glass bottle or jar affects the sound made when either tapping the glass with a pencil, blowing across the top of the bottle or running a wet finger around the rim. Find out how full the bottle or jar must be to make a high-pitched sound or a low-pitched sound. Record your results in a table and identify any patterns found.
Fri	Phonics	Maths	Music	Choose a film to watch that is a musical, it might be Frozen, Trolls or The Greatest Showman. During each song, discuss how the characters are feeling and how the music tells us this. When they are sad is the music slow? When they are happy is the music fast? Can you hear any specific instruments in the music? Think about the music throughout the film, not just in the musical numbers. Music can be used to build suspense or make you feel a certain way when you watch a film.

#### Suggested activities

#### **Phonics:**

Log in to Phonics Play - **username** march 20 **password** home – access some of the games. Phonics lessons at school last for approx. 20 minutes.

- Use Phonics Play to play some of the games.
- On <a href="http://phonicsplaycomics.co.uk/comics.html">http://phonicsplaycomics.co.uk/comics.html</a> you can find comic strips that are completely decodable. The children can practise their reading with these.
- Silly Sentences For each of the words in this list, come up with a silly sentence. **Snail, leap, bone, tray, week, snow**. See who can come up with the silliest sentence, have a good giggle together. Write your sentences and read them to each other, who has the silliest? Remember to include finger spaces, capital letters and full stops.
- Visit twinkl and have a look at the 'Phonopoly' game, it is a mixture of phonics and monopoly!
