

Project homework – Towers, Tunnels and Turrets – Spring 2



Our topic this term is called 'Towers, Tunnels and Turrets'. We will be learning all about different castles, traditional fairytales (plus those with a bit of a twist!) and exploring everyday materials to make structures of our own!

Create a story map of your favourite fairytale story. Or create a new version of a known fairytale. How is it different?	Look around your house and notice the materials things are made out of. Can you use scientific language to describe the properties of the materials you find? You can use words such as smooth, rough, hard, bendy.	We're going on a trip to Raby Castle! Do some research before our trip to discover why the castle is so important in History. Write 3 facts to show your findings.	Create a fact file about a famous castle in one of the four capitals of the United Kingdom.
Make an information book about castles, bridges or tunnels. Include downloaded images, as well as drawings and diagrams. What fascinating facts can you find out to amaze your family, friends and teacher?	Make a detailed diagram of a castle, labelling interesting features which might be found inside, or out. Perhaps you could find out about murder holes, garderobes or loopholes?	Investigate our local Transporter Bridge. Can you make a fact file about why it is such an important structure?	Play a tumbling tower game such as Jenga, with your family. What are the best ways of keeping the tower upright? See if you can take some action shots or videos of the tower falling!
