

Task 2→ Write and perform your own song!

It's pretty simple to write and create your own song and incredibly fun. You just need five easy ingredients and you will have a song before you know it! Are you up for the challenge of writing a verse, chorus, verse song? Once you have written your song in your purple book, can you perform it?

You Will Need:

1. A Topic

What is your song going to be about? Where can you find inspiration? Everywhere! What are your interests? Dinosaurs, dolls, colouring... What time of year is it? Halloween, spring break, Christmas... The inspiration for making up your own song is all around you—just take your pick and you're ready for the next step.

2. A Melody

I recommend using melodies of songs you already know. Some classics like *Twinkle Twinkle Little Star, When the Saints Go Marching In* and *Jingle Bells* are great easy melodies. It can even be a melody from a current pop song. All you need to do is use the melody as a guide and replace the lyrics to suit your song topic.

3. A Chorus

This is the part of the songs that you keep coming back to. The chorus is the main part of your song that will become to the heart of the song. When you come up with the chorus, make sure you write about the theme of your song. The other very important and fun part is the rhyming scheme. Writing songs is a great way for you to develop your rhyming skills.

4. <u>Verses</u>

The verses are where you can develop the topic of the song or start to tell the story. You can do what you like with the verses—just make sure you are sticking to your melody and be sure to maintain a rhyming scheme.

5. A Purpose

What are you writing this song for? You may simply be writing for fun, or to learn something new.
