#### Spellings with the ai sound spelled ei, eigh or ey.

Although these words may appear more straightforward than usual, it is common for children to use the incorrect spelling of the sound so it is important that this rule is recapped.

The words towards the bottom are **homophones** so we have included a few extra words (that don't contain ei, eigh or ey) to help children understand the difference.




