Find all the nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs, highlighting them in different colours or grouping them in lists.	<u>Maths</u> Explore Purple Mash. Follow instructions below to get set up on the website... Thurs	<p><u>English</u></p> <p>Twenty minutes reading every day.</p> <p>Writing Look out of a window – what can you see? Write a descriptive paragraph containing lots of language features you have learned this year (e.g. fronted adverbials, similes, alliteration, powerful adjectives etc.)</p>	<p><u>Maths</u></p> <p>15 mins: Use Purple Mash or an alternative maths website for mental maths warm up.</p> <p>On Twinkl type in Year 4 adding and subtracting fractions. The first document that comes up is perfect for practising this skill (denominator does not change)</p>	<p><u>Science</u></p> <p>Although it is unrelated to our topic, year four were due to cover food chains this term. Make it fun by creating a food chain from natural resources or as a piece of art work (see examples).</p> <p>Ensure children understand key terms such as: producer, primary consumer, secondary consumer, predator and prey.
