Why do you think the line 'will you still need me, will you still feed me' is repeated throughout the song?

The male character wants to make sure his wife will still be with him as he gets older. He wants reassurance.

It says at the beginning of the text 'when I get older, losing my hair, many years from now' so this shows that he is a lot younger than 64.

What do you think happens to the two characters throughout the song?

They start to age.

What does this show?
