- 6. Where do you think the story takes place? Why do you think this?



So the sight of a yacht sailing straight towards them filled everyone with dread, they didn't want to be 'discovered'.


From behind rocks, and within the shadows of the trees they anxiously watched and waited, willing the yacht to sail past...it didn't!

A Starter for 10

The next part of science that Y5 were due to cover was Animals including Humans. The fifth unit is called 'Life Expectancy'.

This lesson extends the enquiry from Lesson 5. Children will now explore if there is a relationship between life expectancy and gestation periods. They will present their findings and discuss the type of relationship between the two variables that the data is showing.
