Suggested activities

Maths

We have been working with numbers up to 10,000,000:

- Write down numbers up to 10,000,000 in words and ask the children to write them in figures.
- Write numbers up to 10,000,000 in figures and ask the children to write them in words
- Use the < and > symbols to compare numbers up to 10,000,000.
- Write the children a list of numbers up to 10,000,000 and ask them to order them smallest to largest.
- Write some numbers and underline a digit. Ask the children to write the value of the underlined digit. 1,345,789= 40,000
- You can still work your way through the Y6 Maths Revision Workbooks. Although KS2 SATs have been cancelled, these are still relevant.
- You can still work your way through the Y6 Maths Homework Workbooks.

English: Writing

Please also complete some free writing on a topic of your choice. This should be of Y6 standard. We have included some ideas below to get your started.

Stories

- Retell a familiar story.
- Retell a story with a twist – maybe you could change the ending, or write from another character's point of view.
- Use a familiar story to create a diary, letter or report.
- Write a story about your day, but on a different planet.
- Write a suspenseful paragraph to start a story.
- Write a setting or character description.

Non-Chronological Reports & Fact Files

- Write a report about a topic you have learned about in Y6.
- Write a report or fact file about something you like – for example. Fortnite, ice-skating, dancing. The choice is yours!
- Write a fact file or report about a famous person you admire.
- Write a fact file or report about yourself or someone you know.

Letters

- Formal letters to complain or to persuade.
- Letters about a topic that we have learned about.
- Informal letters to family or friends.
- Write a letter to your future self, telling them all about what is happening right now.

Diaries

- Use a familiar story to create a diary.
- Write a diary about an important event in your life.
- Write a diary from a famous person's point of view.

You could also write poems, instructions, police reports, newspaper articles, biographies, and explanations. You could also create informative or persuasive leaflets, or adverts! The choice is yours.
