Suggested activities

Maths

Formal methods of addition and subtraction:

- Add large numbers with a different number of digits-ensure digits are lined up correctly.
- Add numbers in different contexts for example money, weight and capacity. Include decimals ensure children line up decimals correctly.
- Subtract large numbers with different number of digits again a common mistake is that children do not line up columns correctly. Add decimals ensuring decimal point is lined up correctly.
- Subtract decimals from whole numbers, for example 7- 3.45 encourage children to use place holders so columns are lined up. 7.00 -

3.45
